NOTE: Consistent with Section 2003 of the SUPPORT Act, there is no requirement for Part D sponsors or pharmacists to verify that a prescriber has a waiver (or is otherwise exempt) from CMS EPCS requirements before covering or dispensing a Part D drug. The CMS EPCS requirement does not affect the ability of the Part D plan to cover or the pharmacists' ability to continue to dispense covered Part D drugs from otherwise valid written, oral, or fax prescriptions that are consistent with laws and regulations.

THE SUPPORT ACT AND ELECTRONIC PRESCRIBING FOR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

The Substance Use Disorder Prevention that Promotes Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients and Communities (SUPPORT Act) was enacted in 2018. The legislation mandates that in 2023 prescribers are to use Electronic Prescribing for Controlled Substances (EPCS) to communicate 70% of controlled substance prescriptions for patients with Medicare Part D. The below F.A.Q. may help with understanding the SUPPORT Act mandate and what EPCS entails.

What is the definition of Electronic Prescribing for Controlled Substances (EPCS)?

EPCS refers to the technical solution that allows the prescriber to electronically transmit a controlled substance prescription directly to absolute pharmacy.

What is the SUPPORT Act and how does it impact controlled substance prescribing?

According to [cms.gov](https://www.cms.gov), "Section 2003 of the SUPPORT Act mandates that the prescribing of a Schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substance under Medicare Part D prescription drug plans and Medicare Advantage prescription drug (MA-PD) plans be done electronically in accordance with an electronic prescription drug program. The first measurement year for compliance with the requirements of the EPCS Program begins January 1, 2023 and ends December 31, 2023".

What are the important dates regarding the SUPPORT Act Mandate?

The below dates can be found at <https://www.cms.gov/medicare/e-health/ePrescribing>

- November 18, 2022 – Calendar Year 2023 Physician Fee Schedule Final Rule released
- January 1, 2023 – Compliance start date for 2023 measurement year
- December 31, 2023 – Compliance end date for 2023 measurement year
- Summer 2024 – CMS analysis of Part D Prescription Claims Data for 2023 measurement year begins after Medicare Part D reconciliation period
- Summer/Fall 2024 – Non-compliance notices sent and EPCS compliance available via an EPCS Dashboard
- Summer/Fall 2024 – EPCS waiver application period open for 2023 measurement year
- Late 2024 – Prescriber notification of waiver approval or denial for 2023 measurement year



What are the benefits of EPCS?

Will 2FA be needed for EPCS and what is it?

Yes, 2FA will be required for prescribing controlled substances. You will be required to validate two of three of the following factors:

1. Something you know, like a username and password
2. Something you have, like a token (such as a onetime password device)
3. Something you are, like a biometric identifier

Every EPCS solution will have different two factor authentication solutions but knowing it will be needed will help with preparation and user engagement.
